outside/3. Single figure against shell splintered/wall/4. Head in a shelter – head in a box/closed in/5 Figures wrapped in blankets/6 Figure in a bombed street/Tilbury Shelter/Figures showing faces lit up – rest/of bodies in silhouette/Figures lying against platform with great bales of paper above also making/beds/Perambulators with bundles/(Dismal crossed through) Dramatic, dismal lit, masses of reclining figures fading to perspective/point – Scribbles and scratches, chaotic foreground. Chains hanging from/old crane/Sick woman in bathchair. Bearded Jews blanketed sleeping in deck/chairs /Lascars tunnel (bundles of old clothes that are people)/Bunks with women feeding children/Dark wet settings (entrance to Tilbury)/Men with shawls to keep off draughts, women wearing handkerchiefs on heads/Muck & rubbish & chaotic untidiness around
